1 HOUR PARKING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to install 1 Hour Parking Restriction signs at the below listed locations:

WARD MISCELLEANEOUS:

S. Komensky Avenue; Repeal One Hour Parking, S. Komensky Avenue (both sides) from W. 47th Street to the first alley south thereof, by striking the above [02014-4142]

N. Ravenswood Avenue; Repeal One Hour Parking ordinance passed 06/19/90, journal

page18716, which reads: N. Ravenswood Avenue (east side) from a point 320 feet south of W. Winnemac Avenue to a point 55 feet south thereof; One Hour Parking, 8:00am to 5:00pm, Monday

through Friday, by striking the above - (14-00406048) [02013-9479]
