BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO;

SECTION 1. Pursuant to an ordinance heretofore passed by the City Council which allows erection of honorary street-name signs, the Commissioner of Transportation shall take the necessary action for standardization of West Fillmore Street, from South Central Park Avenue to South Homan Avenue as "Reverend J.E. Storey Way."

He is a people's person and very approachable. Since retiring, he is available for counseling on a daily basis.
