MISCELLANEOUS SIGNS

PARKING PROHIBITED DURING SPECIFIED HOURS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. Pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 64, Section 080, of the Municipal Code of Chicago, the operator of a vehicle shall not park such vehicle upon the following public way in the areas indicated during the hours specified:

WARD MISCELLENEOUS:

- 1 N. Francisco Avenue; N. Francisco Avenue (east side) from W. Bloomingdale Avenue to W. Armitage Avenue; No Parking Street Cleaning, 9:00am to 3:00pm, 3rd Wednesday of the Month, April 01 through November 30, Weather Permitting, November 30 through April 01, No Parking Tow Zone - (13-00785302) [02013-1329]
- 1 N. Mozart Street; N. Mozart Street (west side) from W. Armitage Avenue to W. Bloomingdale Avenue; No Parking Street Cleaning, 9:00am to 3:00pm, 3rd Tuesday of the Month, April 01 through November 30, Weather Permitting, November 30 through April 01, No Parking Tow Zone - (13-00767121) [02013-1330]

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.
