### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

**SECTION 1.** That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to install Reserved Disabled Parking signs at the below listed locations:

### WARD MISCELLENEOUS:

- 29 601 S. Central Avenue; W. Harrison Street (south side) from a point 43 feet east of S. Central Avenue to a point 25 feet east thereof; Reserved (2% Disabled) Parking, all times, all days, Public Benefit - (14-00507522) [02013-9186]
- 32 2901 N. Clybourn Avenue; N. Clybourn Avenue (east side) from a point 20 feet west of N. Hoyne Avenue to a point 25 feet west thereof; Reserved (2% Disabled) Parking, 9:00am to 3:00pm, Monday through Friday, and 9:00am to 1:00pm, Saturday, Public Benefit - (14-00512730) [02013-9529]
- 50 N. Mozart Avenue; 6714 N. Mozart Avenue; Reserved (2% Disabled) Parking, all times, all days, Public Benefit [02014-6728]

**SECTION 2.** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.
