ORDINANCE COLUMBIA COLLEGE Acct. No. 85612-1

Permit No. 1116102

#### Be It Ordained by the City Council ofthe City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to COLUMBIA COLLEGE, upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to maintain and use, as now constructed, two (2) Fire Escape(s) projecting over the public right-of-way adjacent to its premises known as 33 E. Congress Pkwy..

Said Fire Escape(s) at North Public Alley measure(s):

One (1) at ten point eight three (10.83) feet in length, and five point one six (5.16) feet in width for a total of fifty-five point eight (55.88) square feet.

Said Fire Escape(s) at South Public Alley measure(s):

One (1) at ten point eight three (10.83) feet in length, and five point one six (5.16) feet in width for a total of fifty-five point eight (55.88) square feet.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Transportation (Division of Project Development).

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1116102 herein granted the sum of eight hundred (\$800.00) per annum in advance.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.

The permit holder agrees to hold the City of Chicago harmless for any damage, relocation or replacement costs
