

WHEREAS, hospitals in the City of Chicago and hospitals throughout Illinois are the cornerstone of a strong and vibrant local and state health care delivery system; and

WHEREAS, hospitals, in good faith and partnership with the General Assembly, have engaged in many collaborations to help the state finance the Medicaid program, including absorbing \$380 million in Medicaid cuts since 2011, and bringing the state more than \$1 billion in federal funds annually, including \$400 million to non-hospital providers through the Hospital Assessment Program; and

WHEREAS, hospitals across Illinois are major economic engines and employers for local communities and the state, with hospitals in the City of Chicago serving as one of the largest employers in the community, supporting an estimated 112,775 in direct and secondary jobs, and with hospitals statewide providing nearly 450,000 direct and indirect jobs and generating more than \$83 billion in economic impact annually; and

WHEREAS, these Medicaid cuts could jeopardize access to health care services and good paying, professional jobs; and

WHEREAS, uncertainty in state Medicaid reimbursements could potentially make hospitals vulnerable to credit downgrades, higher interest rates and loss of access to the capital markets, which could halt capital and construction projects and limit the direct and indirect economic benefits generated by this key sector across the state; and

WHEREAS, hospitals cannot absorb these Medicaid cuts, provide quality care to Chicago residents and transform the Medicaid program and health care delivery at the same time; therefore, be it
