Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO (FILE #8), upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to maintain and use, as now constructed, one (1) Underground Steam Conduit(s) under the public right-of-way adjacent to its premises known as 5800 S. University Ave.. Existing conduit contains a two (2) inch steam line, a one and one-quarter (1.25) inch return line and three-quarter (.75) inch air main beginning at an existing pipe tunnel under the west sidewalk in South University Avenue, at a point three hundred fifty-seven (357) feet north of the north curb line of East 59th Street; thence proceeding southward approximately forty-five (45) feet; thence eastward under and across South University Avenue approximately three hundred twelve (312) feet north of the north curb line of East 59th Street; thence proceeding southward under the sidewalk on the east side of South University Avenue to a point approximately one hundred thirty-two (132) feet north of the north curb line of East 59th Street; and thence turning east to enter private property at the east side of said sidewalk, together with such manholes and or means of access as may be required for maintenance of said steam service pipes.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Planning and Development and Department of Transportation (Office of Underground Coordination).

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1123045 herein granted the sum of four hundred (\$400.00) per annum in advance.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.
