ORDINANCE

New Moms Housing Development LLC Acct. No.

365869 -1 Permit No. 1125305

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to New Moms Housing Development LLC, upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to maintain and use, as now constructed, two (2) Earth Retention System(s) under the public right-of-way adjacent to its premises known as 5317 W. Chicago Ave..

Said Earth Retention System(s) at W. Chicago Avenue measure(s):

One (1) at twenty-four (24) feet in length, and point six seven (.67) feet in width for a total of sixteen point zero eight (16.08) square feet. Existing earth retention is approximately fourteen (14) feet below grade level.

Said Earth Retention System(s) at Public Alley measure(s):

One (1) at forty-five (45) feet in length, and two point five (2.5) feet in width for a total of one hundred twelve point five (112.5) square feet. Existing earth retention system is approximately fourteen (14) feet below grade level.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Transportation (Office of Underground Coordination).


This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1125305 herein granted the sum of eight hundred (\$800.00) per annum in advance.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.

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The permit holder agrees to hold the City of Chicago harmless for any damage, relocation or replacement costs associated with damage, relocation or removal of private property caused by the City performing work in the public way.
