#### WARD MISCELLENEOUS:

- 24 3300-3399 and 3500-3599 West Harrison Street; West Harrison Street (north side) from South Homan Avenue to South Spaulding Avenue; No Parking of Trucks, All Times, All Days - (16-03254777) [02016-3189]
- 24 3500-3599 West Harrison Street; West Harrison Street (north side) from South St Louis Avenue to South Central Park Avenue; No Parking of Trucks, All Times, All Days - (16-03251383 ) [02016-3217]
