SCHOOL PARKING

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to establish and/or amend School Parking Restriction Signs at the below listed locations:

WARD MISCELLENEOUS:

- 24 1749 South Christiana Avenue; 1749 South Christiana Avenue (east side) from a point 30 feet north of West Ogden Avenue to a point 120 feet north thereof; No Parking Except School Personnel, 7:00am to 6:00pm, Monday through Friday, School Days [02017-1900]
- 24 1768 South Spaulding Avenue; South Spaulding Avenue (west side) from a point 25 feet north of West Ogden Avenue to a point 125 feet north thereof; No Parking Except School Personnel, 7:00am to 6:00pm, Monday through Friday, School Days [02017-1901]

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.
