SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to install and/or amend Reserved Parking (2% Disabled) Signs at the below listed locations:

WARD MISCELLANEOUS:

12 3528 South Hermitage Avenue; South Hermitage Avenue (west side) from a point 209

feet north of West 36th Street to a point 40 feet north thereof; Reserved Parking (2% Disabled), Public

12 3615 South Hoyne Avenue; 3615 South Hoyne Avenue (east side) from a point 30 feet

south of West 36th Street to a point 10 feet south thereof, Reserved Parking (2% Disabled), Public Benefit
