NO PARKING TOW ZONE EXCEPT SCHOOL PERSONNEL

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to establish and/or amend No Parking Tow Zone Except School Personnel Signs at the below listed locations:

WARD MISCELLEANEOUS:

- 23 West 64th Place (south side) from a point 20 feet west of South Nottingham Avenue to a point 295 feet west thereof; No Parking Tow Zone Except School Personnel, 7:00am to 4:30pm, School Days - (19-01050817) [02019-1569]
- 23 South Nottingham Avenue (east side) from a point 20 feet north of West 65th Street to a point 85 feet north thereof; No Parking Tow Zone Except For Authorized School Personnel, 7:00am to 4:30pm, School Days - (19-01050800) [O2019-1575]

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.
