39 North Keating Avenue: Repeal Ordinance Passed 7/1/63 Journal page; 531 which reads: North Keating Avenue (west side) from West Peterson Avenue to the first alley north thereof; One Hour Parking, 9:00am to 6:00pm Except Sundays and Holidays, by Striking the above and inserting: North Keating Avenue (west side) from West Peterson Avenue to the first alley north thereof; Three Hour Parking, 8:00am to 8:00pm, Monday through Friday (Public Benefit) - (19-02032530) [02019-8032]
