ORDINANCE AGENCY EA Acct.
No. 397810-2 Permit No. 1146967

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to AGENCY EA, upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to maintain and use, as now constructed, six (6) Planter Railling(s) on the public right-of-way for beautification purposes adjacent to its premises known as 920 N. Franklin St..

Said Planter Railling(s) at N FRANKLIN ST measure(s):

Two (2) at fourteen (14) feet in length, and point three three (.33) feet in width for a total of nine point two four (9.24) square feet.

Two (2) at ten (10) feet in length, and point three three (.33) feet in width for a total of six point six (6.6) square feet. Said

Planter Railling(s) at W WALTON measure(s):

Two (2) at twelve (12) feet in length, and point three three (.33) feet in width for a total of seven point nine two (7.92) square feet.

Grantee must allow the required clear and unobstructed space for pedestrian passage at all times per rules and regulations approved by the Department of Transportation.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Planning and Development and Department of Transportation (Division of Project Development).

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1146967 herein granted the sum of zero (\$.00) per annum in advance.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.

The permit holder agrees to hold the City of Chicago harmless for any damage, relocation or replacement costs associated with damage, relocation or removal of private property caused by the City performing work in the public way.
