#### 2% DISABLED PARKING SIGN

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

**SECTION 1. That the Commissioner of Transportation is hereby authorized and directed to establish and/or amend 2% Disabled Parking Signs at the below listed locations:**

#### WARD 2% DISABLED PARKING SIGN:

- 1 1420 West Hubbard, North Side, from a point 20 feet West of North Noble, to a point 20 feet West thereof. Reserved Disabled Parking [02020-1883] 20-02940014
- 1 2412 North Rockwell Street Reserved Disabled Permit Parking; on North Rockwell Street, Westside, from a point approximately 130 feet north of West Fullerton Avenue, to a point 20 feet North thereof. [02020-4358] 20-03336428

**SECTION 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force here in after its passage and publication.**
