ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the City of Chicago ("City") is a home rule unit of local government pursuant to Article VII, Section 6(a) of the 1970 Constitution of the State of Illinois, and, as such, may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to support the charitable, educational and philanthropic activities of established Not for Profit Corporations and encourage the continued viability and growth of such activities; and

WHEREAS, many Not For Profit Corporations own property that adjoins streets and alleys that are no longer required for public use and might more productively be used in furtherance of such activities; and

WHEREAS, the City would benefit from the vacation of these streets and alleys by reducing City expenditures on maintenance, repair and replacement; by reducing fly-dumping, vandalism and other criminal activity; and by providing support for such charitable, educational and philanthropic activities; and

WHEREAS, the City can promote strong communities by facilitating services to the public, and increase the City's job base through the vacation of public alley for no compensation; and

WHEREAS, the properties at 2334-2358 N. Racine, also known as permanent index No. 14-32-10-106-005-0000 ("the abutting properties") are owned by DePaul University, an Illinois Not For Profit Corporation; and

WHEREAS, DePaul University, an Illinois Not For Profit Corporation, uses its facilities at this site for higher level education; and

WHEREAS, DePaul University, an Illinois Not For Profit Corporation, proposes to use the portion of the public street to be vacated herein for the construction of a new theater school, containing theaters, classrooms, offices, and accessory facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Chicago, after due investigation and consideration, has determined that the nature and extent of the public use and the public interest to be subserved is such as to warrant the vacation of parts of public street described in the following ordinance; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO:

SECTION 1. AN that part of West Medill Avenue (formerly known as Huber Place) in the resubdivision of the Northeast % of block 12 of Sheffield's Addition to Chicago in Section 32, Township 40 North, Range 14, East of the Third Principal Meridian, according to the plat thereof recorded January 18, 1904 as Document 3490274; lying north of the most southerly north line of Lot 31, in the resubdivision of the northeast % of block 12 of Sheffield's Addition to Chicago in Section 32 aforesaid; lying south of the south line of Lot 30 and its westerly extension, in the resubdivision of the northeast % of block 12 of Sheffield's Addition to Chicago in Section 32 aforesaid; lying east of the most westerly east line of Lot 31 aforesaid, and lying west of a line drawn from the

shall not be limited to: educational and artistic purposes and for such use and improvements that are accessory, as that term is defined in the Chicago Zoning Ordinance, to such social service purposes, such uses and improvements to be owned and operated by a non-profit corporation, subject to the approval of the Corporation Counsel as to form and legality. The restriction on use and improvement in the covenant, agreement or instrument shall be for a term of 40 years and upon breach of such restriction the public way herein vacated shall revert to the City to be subject to the terms and conditions of the dedication by which it has been heretofore held by the City.
