ORDINANCE EPIC BURGER Inc. Acct. No. 331323 - 5 Permit No. 1098909

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to EPIC BURGER Inc., upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to construct, install, maintain and use four (4) Awning(s) projecting over the public right -of-way adjacent to its premises known as 40 E. Pearson St..

Said Awning(s) at N. Wabash measure(s):

One (1) at eleven point six six (11.66) feet in length, and five (5) feet in width for a total of fifty-eight point three (58.3) square feet.

One (1) at twelve point seven five (12.75) feet in length, and five (5) feet in width for a total of sixty-three point seven five (63.75) square feet.

Said Awning(s) at E. Pearson measure(s):

One (1) at twelve point seven five (12.75) feet in length, and five (5) feet in width for a total of sixty-three point seven five (63.75) square feet.

One (1) at fifteen point three three (15.33) feet in length, and five (5) feet in width for a total of seventy-six point six five (76.65) square feet.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Zoning Department - Signs.

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1098909 herein granted the sum of one hundred seventy-five (\$175.00) per annum in advance.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.

The permit holder agrees to hold the City of Chicago harmless for any damage, relocation or replacement costs associated with damage, relocation or removal of private property caused by the City performing work in the public way.
