WHEREAS, William and Carole's philanthropy extended to numerous organizations and were instrumental in Christmas Food Packing that would feed up to 4,000 families through various charities throughout the Cook, Dupage, and Kane counties; and

WHEREAS, William was a Board Member of the Daughters of St. Paul and was very involved with their organization; and
