ORDINANCE

THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO Acct. No. 43697 - 91 Permit No. 1093833

Be It Ordained by the City Council of the City of Chicago:

SECTION 1. Permission and authority are hereby given and granted to THE UNIVERSITY OF CHICAGO, upon the terms and subject to the conditions of this ordinance to maintain and use, as now constructed, two (2) kiosks on the public right-

of-way adjacent to its premises known as 5730 S. Drexel Ave..

Said Sign(s) at S. DREXEL measure(s):

One (1) at five point five (5.5) feet in length, and ten (10) feet in width for a total of fifty-five (55) square feet. One (1) at four (4) feet in length, and five point seven five (5.75) feet in width for a total of twenty-three (23) square feet.

The location of said privilege shall be as shown on prints kept on file with the Department of Business Affairs and Consumer Protection and the Office of the City Clerk.

Said privilege shall be constructed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Department of Transportation (Division of Project Development) and Zoning Department - Signs.

This grant of privilege in the public way shall be subject to the provisions of Section 10-28-015 and all other required provisions of the Municipal Code of Chicago.

The grantee shall pay to the City of Chicago as compensation for the privilege #1093833 herein granted the sum of eight hundred (\$800,00) per annum to commence (1) one year after passage.

A 25% penalty will be added for payments received after due date.

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The permit holder agrees to hold the City of Chicago harmless for any damage, relocation or replacement costs associated with damage, relocation or removal of private property caused by the City performing work in the public way.
